CONTAINER GROWN SECTION

CLASS

1. A hyacinth grown in a container
2. 3 Hyacinths grown in a container
3. Miniature daffodils or narcissi, in a pot not to exceed 6"
4. Daffodils or narcissi, 1 variety in a pot not to exceed 6" (excluding miniatures)
5. Daffodils or narcissi, in a container not to exceed 10"
6. Specie tulips, 1 variety in a pot not to exceed 6"
7. Tulips grown in a pot not to exceed 10"
8. Polyanthus or primulas grown in a 5" pot
9. Amaryllis in a container
10. Container not to exceed 5" of any bulb not included in above classes
11. Container not to exceed 10" of any bulb not included in above classes
12. Flowering pot plant in a pot not to exceed 5"
13. Flowering pot plant in a pot not to exceed 10"
14. Foliage plant in a pot not to exceed 5"
15. Foliage plant in a pot not to exceed 10"
16. A cactus in a pot not to exceed 5"
17. A succulent, other than cactus, in a pot not to exceed 5"
18. A cactus any size, pot not to exceed 10"
19. A succulent, other than cactus, any size, pot not to exceed 10"
20. An alpine in a pot not to exceed 5"
21. 3 alpines in pots not to exceed 5"

CUT BLOOM SECTION (ALL VASES PROVIDED)

CLASS

22. Wallflowers 3 stems
23. 1 Specimen bloom trumpet daffodil, foliage optional
24. 1 Specimen bloom any narcissus, foliage optional
25. 3 Trumpet daffodils, 1 variety (without foliage)
26. 3 Miniature trumpet daffodils or narcissi
27. 3 Stems multiheaded trumpet daffodils or narcissi (without foliage)
28. 3 Stems any other trumpet daffodil or narcissi, 1 variety (without foliage)
29. 5 Stems any trumpet daffodil or narcissus (without foliage)
30. 1 Tulip, to be shown with foliage
31. 3 Tulips, any variety, to be shown with foliage
32. 3 Stems any primula including polyanthus
33. 6 Stems any primula including polyanthus
34. Vase of mixed flowering shrubs (flowering trees and woody climbers are eligible)

35. Vase of mixed foliage
36. Vase of mixed spring flowers with foliage (excluding any foliage eligible for class 33)
37. 5 Sticks rhubarb – trimmed and tied

DISPLAY SECTION

CLASS

38. Trough up to 24" in length; plants must be growing in the trough
39. Container not to exceed 12" x 12"; plants must be growing in the container
40. An arrangement of pot plants, 2ft x 2ft space
41. Pot-et-fleur: an exhibit of growing plants which may or may not be flowering, in or out of pots, together with additional fresh cut flowers. Accessories, moss, driftwood may also be included. It must be assembled in one container. No additional cut foliage, other than that attached to the stems of the flowers, is permitted.
42. An arrangement of cacti and succulents, 2ft x 2ft space

CHILDREN'S SECTION

CLASS

43. A collection of flowers in a bottle
44. A painting or drawing
45. Wallpaper design A4 size made by "potato printing"
46. 3D model of a daffodil

HANDICRAFT SECTION

CLASS

47. Painting or drawing, not to exceed A3
48. An exhibit of needlecraft (embroidery, smocking, knitting, tapestry or similar)
49. A knitted, or crocheted garment or item
50. An exhibit of handicraft other than those specified

FLORAL ART SECTION

EXCEPT CLASSES 55 AND 56, ALL FLORAL ART EXHIBITS TO BE ARRANGED IN THE HALL. ANY PRE-ARRANGED EXHIBITS IN CLASSES 51 TO 54 WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Any natural plant material (including seed heads, berries, driftwood and dried, painted or dyed flowers) may be used unless otherwise stated. Drapes and accessories are allowed unless otherwise stated.

CLASS

51. "Artist's palette" 60cm x 60cm. Open to anyone not previously awarded a first prize in a floral art class.

- 52. "Starry, starry night" Space allowed 60cm x 60cm. An exhibit featuring two placements
- 53. "A study in yellow". Space allowed 60cm x 60cm.
- 54. "Still life". Space allowed 60cm x 60cm . Props allowed
- 55. "Millefiori" (As in paperweight). A petite exhibit - artificial plant material allowed. Space allowed 25cm width, 25cm depth and 25cm height. (May be made at home)
- 56. "Portrait ". Featuring a photo. A miniature exhibit. Space allowed 10cm width, 10cm depth and 10cm height. (may be made at home)

CLASS

- 57. 1 Jar of marmalade
- 58. 1 Jar of Jam
- 59. 1 Jar of chutney
- 60. Tea bread (as recipe)
- 61. 5 Wholemeal rolls
- 62. Tart tatin
- 63. Sausage meat plait (as recipe)
- 64. "Firmament" A decorated dummy cake, judged for decoration only, decorations to be edible.

PHOTOGRAPHIC

Prints up to A5, mounted on card or paper

CLASS

- 65. 1 Print "The face of gardening"
- 66. 1 print any subject

CLASS 60 Tea Bread

- 225g/8oz self-raising flour
- 350g/12oz mixed dried fruit
- One cup of cold tea

110g/4oz brown sugar
1 egg beaten

1. Soak dried fruit and sugar in cold tea overnight.
2. Sift the flour into a mixing bowl, add the beaten egg and soaked fruit
3. Stir well, place in a loaf tin lined with greaseproof paper and bake for 1½ hours at 170C/325F/gas mark 3.

CLASS 63 Sausage meat plait

- 225g/8oz short crust pastry
- 2 tomatoes
- 60g/2oz mushrooms
- Salt & pepper

225g/8oz sausage meat
1 small onion
Mixed herbs
1 egg, beaten

Heat the oven to 200C/400F/gas mark 6. Make the pastry. Chop the tomatoes, onion and mushrooms and mix with the sausage meat, herbs and seasoning.

Roll out the pastry to about 12" by 9" and place on a greased baking tray. Arrange the filling down the centre of the pastry before cutting strips, at an angle, either side of the filling. Fold the strips alternately over the filling in a plait. Brush with beaten egg and bake for 30-35 minutes.
