<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A collection of 3 types of vegetables from this list of 8, quantities of each kind are shown in brackets: Carrots (3), Cauliflower (2), Onions (3), Parsnips (3), Peas (6 pods), Potatoes (3), Runner beans (6 pods), Tomatoes (6).</li><li>• Judged out of 60 points (20 points for <u>each type of vegetable</u> - 7 for size, shape and colour: 7 for condition: 6 for uniformity.)</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A vase of mixed flowering stems containing a total of between 5 and 10 stems, taken from a minimum of <u>two different kinds of plants</u>. Flowers only - no seed heads, berries or accessories are allowed</li><li>• Judged out of 35 points - 25 for colour, form condition, quality and freshness, 10 points for overall presentation and effect, viewed from all directions.</li></ul>

**Class 22 ANY OTHER VEGETABLES:** The number of vegetables to be 2 other than squashes 1 and legumes 5.

**Class 31 COLLECTIONS OF FRUIT:** The numbers of fruits per dish of one kind of fruit to be as follows: soft fruit: 12, stone fruit 5, melon 1, grapes 1 bunch and all other fruits 3. Two varieties of the same plant are not two kinds.

**Class 33 ANY OTHER FRUIT:** The numbers of fruits to be grapes 1 bunch, melon 1 all other fruits 3.

### **Class 107 Plaited loaf “Challah” style (all recipes)**

500g Strong white flour	250ml cold water
1 tablespoon of caster sugar	2 eggs beaten
2 teaspoons salt	1egg yolk (save the white for the egg wash)
7g dried yeast	2 tablespoons sunflower oil

Pre heat oven to 230C /gas 8. Grease a baking tray.

Put the flour, sugar, salt and yeast in a bowl and mix. Make a well in the middle and add the water, beaten eggs, yolk and oil. Mix to a soft, but not sticky dough. Oil a large bowl. Knead the dough until firm and elastic, cover and leave to double its size about 120 minutes.

Knock back the dough with your fists for 2 – 3 minutes until smooth and elastic. Divide the dough into three equal pieces, roll each piece into a 16 inch rope and then plait together. Place on the baking tray, cover and leave to double its size for about an hour. Brush with the egg white, bake for 8 to10 minutes, then reduce the heat to 200C /gas 6 for a further 20 minutes, the loaf should sound hollow when tapped on the bottom. Cool on a wire rack

### **Class 108 Three beetroot brownies by Nadine**

200g plain chocolate bar, 70% cocoa	3 eggs
1tsp vanilla essence	200g caster sugar
100g unsalted butter	100g plain flour
300g cooked beetroot, chopped	25g cocoa powder + pinch of baking powder

Pre heat oven to 180C /160C fan/gas 4. Line a 20cm x 30cm baking tray or small roasting tin.

Either blend the chocolate, vanilla, butter and beetroot, or melt the chocolate and butter and mince the beetroot with a fork before adding along with the vanilla.

Beat the eggs and sugar until thick, pale and foamy. Spoon the beetroot mix into the bowl and fold it into the egg mix. Keep as much air as possible. Sift in the flour, cocoa and baking powder, pour into the tray.

Bake for 25 minutes or until risen all over but slightly soft in the centre. Cool completely in the tin, and then cut into squares. Freezes well.
