CONTAINER GROWN SECTION

CLASS

1. A hyacinth grown in a container
2. 3 Hyacinths grown in a container
3. Miniature daffodils or narcissi, in a pot not to exceed 6"
4. Daffodils or narcissi, 1 variety in a pot not to exceed 6" (excluding miniatures)
5. Daffodils or narcissi, in a container not to exceed 10"
6. Specie tulips, 1 variety in a pot not to exceed 6"
7. Tulips grown in a pot not to exceed 10"
8. Polyanthus or primulas grown in a 5" pot
9. Amaryllis in a container
10. Container not to exceed 5" of any bulb not included in above classes
11. Container not to exceed 10" of any bulb not included in above classes
12. Flowering pot plant in a pot not to exceed 5"
13. Flowering pot plant in a pot not to exceed 10"
14. Foliage plant in a pot not to exceed 5"
15. Foliage plant in a pot not to exceed 10"
16. A cactus in a pot not to exceed 5"
17. A succulent, other than cactus, in a pot not to exceed 5"
18. A cactus any size, pot not to exceed 10"
19. A succulent, other than cactus, any size, pot not to exceed 10"

CUT BLOOM SECTION (ALL VASES PROVIDED)

CLASS

22. Wallflowers 3 stems
23. 1 Specimen bloom trumpet daffodil, foliage optional
24. 1 Specimen bloom any narcissus, foliage optional
25. 3 Trumpet daffodils, 1 variety (without foliage)
26. 3 Miniature trumpet daffodils or narcissi
27. 3 Stems multiheaded trumpet daffodils or narcissi (without foliage)
28. 3 Stems any other trumpet daffodil or narcissi, 1 variety (without foliage)
29. 5 Stems any trumpet daffodil or narcissus (without foliage)
30. 1 Tulip, to be shown with foliage
31. 3 Tulips, any variety, to be shown with foliage
32. 3 Stems any primula including polyanthus
33. 6 Stems any primula including polyanthus
34. Vase of mixed flowering shrubs (flowering trees and woody climbers are eligible)

35. Vase of mixed foliage
36. Vase of mixed spring flowers with foliage (excluding any foliage eligible for class 34)
37. 5 Sticks rhubarb – trimmed and tied

DISPLAY SECTION

CLASS

38. Trough up to 24" in length; plants must be growing in the trough
39. Container not to exceed 12" x 12"; plants must be growing in the container
40. An arrangement of pot plants, 2ft x 2ft space
41. Pot-et-fleur: an exhibit of growing plants which may or may not be flowering, in or out of pots, together with additional fresh cut flowers. Accessories, moss, driftwood may also be included. It must be assembled in one container. No additional cut foliage, other than that attached to the stems of the flowers, is permitted.
42. An arrangement of cacti and succulents, 2ft x 2ft space

CHILDREN'S SECTION

CLASS

43. A arrangement of spring flowers
44. A painting or drawing to include a person/people
45. A birthday card (A4 folded in half)
46. An animal made from any recyclable material

HANDICRAFT SECTION

CLASS

47. Painting or drawing, not to exceed A3
48. An exhibit of needlecraft (embroidery, smocking, tapestry or similar)
49. A knitted, or crocheted garment or item
50. An exhibit of handicraft made from any recyclable material.

FLORAL ART SECTION

EXCEPT CLASSES 55 AND 56, ALL FLORAL ART EXHIBITS TO BE ARRANGED IN THE HALL. ANY PRE-ARRANGED EXHIBITS IN CLASSES 51 TO 54 WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

Any natural plant material (including seed heads, berries, driftwood and dried, painted or dyed flowers) may be used, unless otherwise stated. Drapes and accessories which should not predominate are allowed, unless otherwise stated.

CLASS

51. "Through the looking glass" 60cm x 60cm. Props allowed. Open to anyone not previously awarded a first prize in a floral art class.

52. "Panache". A modern exhibit. Space allowed 60cm x 60cm.
53. "A play or a musical". Show title to be named. Space allowed 60cm x 60cm.
54. "A walk in the woods". An exhibit with an emphasis on foliage. Space allowed 60cm x 60cm . Dried material allowed
55. "Box of delights". A petite exhibit - artificial plant material allowed. Space allowed 25cm width, 25cm depth and 25cm height. (May be made at home)
56. "Cameo". A miniature exhibit. Space allowed 10cm width, 10cm depth and 10cm height. (may be made at home)

57. 1 Jar of marmalade
58. 1 Jar of Lemon curd
59. 5 Macaroons
60. Victoria sponge
61. Wholemeal loaf
62. 3 "Hot" cross buns
63. Homemade pâté in a ramekin sized container
64. Apple tart (as recipe)

PHOTOGRAPHIC

Prints up to A5, mounted on card or paper

CLASS

65. 1 Print "Up the garden path"
66. 1 print any subject

CLASS 64 Apple tart

For the pastry:

- 250 g/9oz plain flour
- 125g/4oz unsalted butter, diced at room temperature
- Pinch of salt
- 1 egg
- 1 tsp cold water

For the filling:

- 15 g/½oz unsalted butter
- 3-4 dessert apples (eg cox, russet etc) peeled cored and each cut into 10 segments
- 65g/2½oz caster sugar, plus tbsp to sprinkle
- ½ tbsp lemon juice
- 100ml/3½fl oz double cream
- 1 egg
- 1-2 tbsp icing sugar, for dusting

Set the oven at 220°C/440°F/Gas mark 7 and place a baking tray to preheat. Sift flour and salt into a bowl and rub in the butter until you reach a sandy texture. Add the egg and water to make dough, don't overwork. Knead briefly, and then flatten the dough between two sheets of cling film and chill for ½ hour. Roll the chilled dough, still between the cling film sheets until 2mm thick. Remove the top layer of cling film, invert and transfer to a tart ring (22cm/9in dia, 2cm/¾in deep recommended) – remove the cling film, prick the base and chill for 20 minutes.

Heat the butter, lemon juice and 15g/1oz of caster sugar in a small saucepan until the sugar has dissolved. Place the apple segments into the chilled tart case in concentric circles, overlapping the slices. Brush the apples with the butter mixture and cook for 10 minutes on the baking tray. Reduce the temperature to 200°C/400°F/Gas mark 6 and cook for a further 20 minutes or until the pastry is pale golden-brown and the sugar has caramelised.

Whisk the cream, egg and the remaining sugar until combined. Sprinkle the tart with a tablespoon of sugar and pour on the cream mixture, bake for 10 minutes or until the filling sets. Remove from oven and allow to cool before removing from the tart ring. Dust with icing sugar.
