Classes 1 to 22: Only one variety of each vegetable to be exhibited

**Class 31 COLLECTIONS OF FRUIT:** The numbers of fruits per dish of one kind of fruit to be as follows: soft fruit: 12, stone fruit 5, melon 1, grapes 1 bunch and all other fruits 3. Two varieties of the same plant are not two kinds.

Class 33 ANY OTHER FRUIT: The numbers of fruits to be: grapes 1 bunch, melon 1 all other fruits minimum 3.

#### Class 102 Bara Brith

8oz/225gm self-raising flour	6oz/170gm Demerara sugar
6 Fl oz/ 170ml milk	8oz/225gm Sultanas
1 large egg	A pinch of salt
½ Teaspoon of gravy browning (optional)	

- 1) Preheat the oven to 180°C/350°F/gas mark 4.
- 2) Grease a 2lb loaf tin
- 3) Put sifted flour, salt, sugar and Sultanas in a bowl (make sure that the sultanas are separated and coated with the flour mixture)
- 4) Beat egg and add the dry mixture with the milk
- 5) Mix well and add the gravy browning if required. The mixture should be quite runny and add enough gravy browning to make the mixture a caramel colour
- 6) Turn into the loaf tin and spread evenly
- 7) Bake on the middle shelf of the oven for approximately one hour. Test with a skewer it should come out clean
- 8) Leave to cool in the tin for 10 15 minutes then turn out onto a wire rack
